ACCOMMODATIONS

TRANSPORTATION

Shuttle. Chattanooga Airport is located about 25 miles from Cleveland, Tennessee, and the Church of God Theological Seminary campus. Car Rental. A vehicle may be rented from either the Chattanooga airport or the Atlanta airport (two-and-a-half hours from Cleveland) by calling Enterprise Car Rental at 1-800-325-8007, Avis at 1-800-831-2847 or some other agency of your choice.

Parking. Free parking is available on the Church of God Theological Seminary campus.

MEALS

Friday and Saturday lunches (\$4.50) and the Saturday evening banquet (\$25) can be taken at the seminary. Participants are on their own for all other meals, which can be taken at nearby restaurants, additional information for which will be given at registration. Early preregistration for the banquet provides for a choice of entrée: (a) beef, (b) chicken or (c) vegetarian. Those who preregister after February 21 will be served the beef entrée.

DIRECTIONS

Cleveland, Tennessee, is located by Interstate 75, approximately 25 miles north of Chattanooga and 80 miles south of Knoxville.
