Today we commemorate the life of George Herbert, priest and poet (1593-1633). He is famous for his poems and his prose work *A Priest in the Temple, or The Country Parson*. He began studying divinity in his early twenties, and in 1626 took Holy Orders. King Charles provided him with a living as rector of the parishes of Fugglestone and Bemerton in 1630. His poems were published posthumously. Two of them are well known hymns, "Teach me, my God and King," and "Let All the World in Every Corner Sing."
