### Wesley, Holiness and Culture:

### Trans-Pacific Perspectives for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century

The Wesleyan and Holiness revivals of the last century have had an important impact on both North American and Asian life. Since the beginning of the twentieth century there has been continuous interaction between North American and Asian peoples based on a common interest in the ideals of the Wesleyan Holiness traditions. In the twenty-first century, these common interests are bringing Asian and North American Wesleyan Holiness people together throughout the world as scholars, missionaries, pastors and lay persons. This conference is organized to explore the commonalities and disjunctions of Wesleyan Holiness experience across the Pacific. The conference looks toward both the past and the future. Given our experiences, how then might we as Wesleyan Holiness people live?

It is hoped that scholars will explore biblical, historical, theological, missiological, philosophical, psychological and other religious and cultural issues rising from the interaction of Wesleyan Holiness ideas and the larger cultural structures in Asia and North America.

The conference will be hosted by Seoul Theological University at Seoul, Korea, May 23-25, 2005. Travel advice for the conference and for tours in Korea will be provided to participants. The proceedings will be published as a book. The deadline for finished papers for the book is March 1, 2005.
