L: Are we able, as followers of Christ, to undertake these tasks?

P: WE ARE NOT ABLE IN AND OF OURSELVES, BUT WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE SPIRIT OF CHRIST AND WITH THE FELLOWSHIP OF THOSE WHO SHARE OUR FRUSTRATIONS AND OUR DREAMS WE ARE ABLE.
