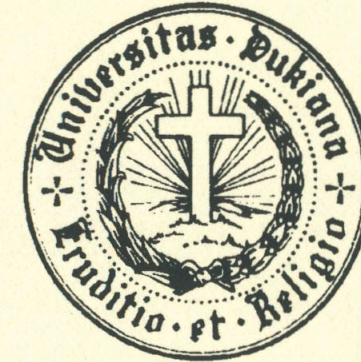
Professors Stanley Hauerwas and Harmon L. Smith return from Spring Semester, 1990, leaves.
