Thanksgiving

O Lord God, whose power and purpose over all life we gratefully acknowledge: In our best moments we seek to thank your, knowing full well that we have nothing you need, since all that we have is a gift from you.

Lord Jesus Christ, whose sojourn among us was the living intercession of God for us: On this day do we pray that you would be near and real to those who are struggling with the questions posed by death; to all imprisoned by the temptation toward habits and behavior that threaten their relationships, well-being, and even their lives; to those children of yours for whom life has lost its significance; and to those who suffer debilitating illness and hardship; to the families whose agony runs so very deep; and to the fledgling faithful whose opportunity it is, like your own, to bring the good news of hope and healing, of life and everlasting life to all who would hear it.
