**Let us partake of the Word in this hour and be renewed!**

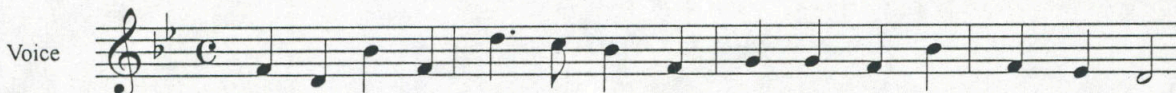

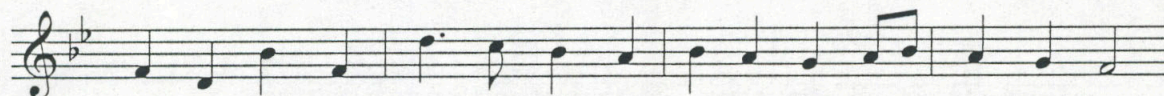

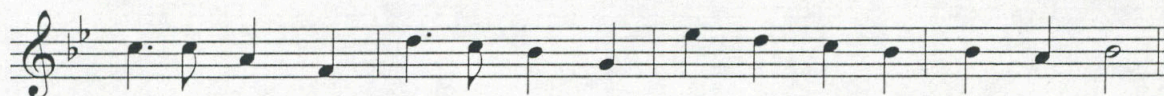
