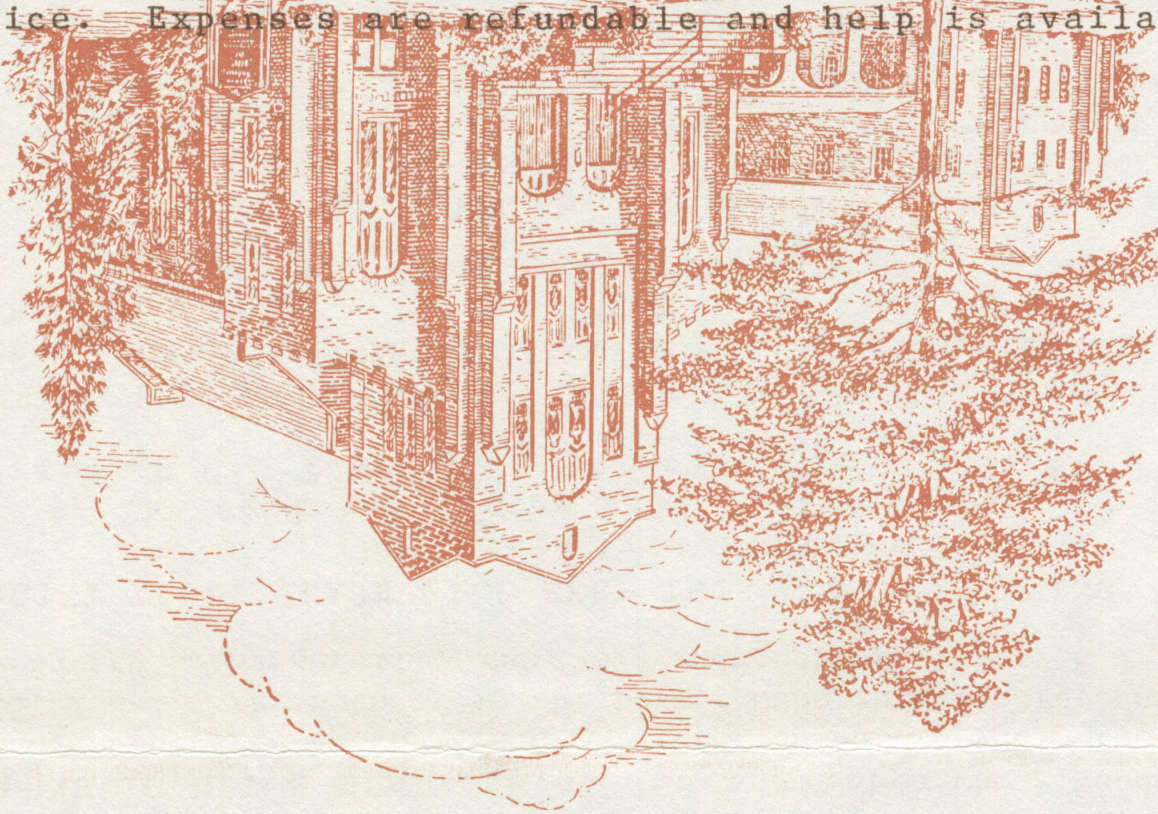
For a Woodwind, Brass and Jazz Ensemble Concert
