The average Roman nobleman lived to be only twenty-five and feared not too early but too late a death: "Whom the gods love," they said, "die young." Dr. Samuel Johnson thought he had over-stayed his time at forty, and at forty-seven Lincoln (before he became President) thought his work was done. Cicero was venerated by his contemporaries as ancient indeed when he barely made sixty. How things have changed! There are now more people over sixty-five than ever before in history (more than 20,000 in Durham). Many today do their best work at a time in life the pagan world dreaded. Therefore, what science has made possible, is up to us to make pleasant and full of purpose. We must not let down and give up as the years pass (Shakespeare quit at forty-seven), but develop a cleaner and much kinder and wiser view of life. The worst sin of old age is to become crass and crafty and cruel. It is a fine art to grow older with graciousness, with deepened faith and hope and love. It can be done. Many do. Isaiah has this lovely line to remember: "Even in your old age ... will I carry you, saith the Lord." (46:4) Prayer: Let not my soul grow grey; O Lord. Keep my affections warm and true and lasting. Keep me ever busy with what I can still do. Always remind me that I am not alone. For Thy love's sake." Amen. 
