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
## Introduction:

- 2. Scripture is part of passe age giving Moses' summary of his work. In Scrip. is something of same idea that applies to becoming proficient in sports, except applies here to doing what God commands. The thought is that to do God's will one must energetically keep in mind His teachings and commandments.
- 3. Idea developed in certain definite steps in Scrip, which are as pertinent now as ever.



## I. Keep the teachings and commands of God in your heart. (v.6)

- 1. Mary kept the words of the 12-year-old Jesus in her heart, thinking of them, speaking of them, always cherishing them. They were of importance to her. The memory probably helped her do better her job as a mother and religious teacher.
- 2. An old minister could quote accurately any desired Biblical passage from memory. He used this gift to help in pastoral visiting and in own life.
- 3. Laughons, and their desire for Scrip. and prayer. Lives the fruit of such thought.




II. "Teach them diligently to thy children," or pass God's teachings on to others as something important and precious.

2. Individual may be sensitive


about it but if given a chance is always anxious to tell others about his hobby, because he is vitally interested in it. (Ex).

- 2. A person with "call to preach" (Embers, Miller?) who feels so called will do so, and will let others know he wants to. Enthusiastic.
- 3. I lesser things, like home, car, state, house, enthusiasm for things shows in conversation. Usually ends in some sort of actions.
- 4. Likewise with God's teachings and commands. Enthusiasm for His word keeps it in forefrom of conversation.




## IV. This focusing of frequent attention on God's teachings is necessary if one is to do His will.
