This quarter, the Woman's Society of Christian Service of Duke Memorial Church has been trying the new plan of meeting - Prayer group meeting at 2:45, the Circles in the S.S. classrooms at 3:00, and the business meeting of the Society at 3:30 in the Chapel and we find that as a whole it works very well. There are a number of places where this could be improved. But the reason for this order is to get the women together in the business meeting and also to save on transportation and time. The first meeting in April, there were 51 present, then in May 92, and our June meeting dropped back to 69. A social hour was held after the meeting in May, and that may have had something to do with the attendance.

At the beginning of the year, our membership was 192. There have been about twelve new members added, and six have dropped out for one reason or another. The net increase is six for the first six months of 1942.

The Durham District meeting was held in the University Church in Chapel Hill, N.C. on Wednesday, May 27th. Duke Memorial had twelve women to attend this meeting. At this time Mrs A.H. Borland was named the new Zone leader for Durham Zone, replacing Mrs A.K. Umstead of Calvary Church.

Mrs H.N. Haines has been elected the Secretary of Young Women's and Girls' Work to serve on the Joint Committee on Missionary Education of Youth.
