

Second quarterly conference -  
1944

At the beginning of the year 1944 the W. S. C. S. of Duke Memorial Church had an enrollment of 204. Nine (9) new members have been added this quarter - making a total enrollment of 213. There are 34 subscribers to the Methodist Women and 41 to the World Outlook - a slight increase over last year.

The Society gave to missions \$388.00. The C. S. Relations committee members visited the Juvenile Court, Family Service Assn., Girl Scout headquarters in order to learn something of the needs of these groups and ways in which we could aid them. Calls, when we promptly answered came from these groups. \$10.00 was given thru the court to 2 needy families as well as used clothing etc. Our regular help to other groups continued. \$351.75 was spent thru this committee and \$50.00 was collected and sent to them.

Members of the Society co-operated  
with other churches in  
organizing and directing home  
visiting in connection with  
the crusade for a New World  
Order. The visiting was climaxed  
by a dinner on March 1 attended  
by 200 people, at which time  
reports were made and two  
"left" the church, after the war  
was discussed by 6 prominent  
speakers.

Several members attended a  
mass meeting on the crusade  
held in Raleigh in February. Many  
also attended the S. E. Joint District  
Conference held in the same  
city on Feb. 22, 24; and the  
District Conference held in  
Durham on April 26.

The Pres. of the Society represented  
the group at the annual N. C.  
Conference held in Wilson, March 7-  
9. And had the privilege



of extending an invitation to the  
Conference to meet in Dunbar  
Mass in 1945. In March the  
circles of the Society started  
showing Sunday night papers  
at cost to the Methodist Youth  
Fellowship.
