Our Church School in its teaching and worship program is doing a good work. Carefully made plans will soon be put into operation with a view not only to reach the absentees but to increase our enrollment. This is one of the major points of emphasis in our Crusade for Christ.

A detailed report of the total activities of our Church School will be given by Mr. W. B. Whitford, our General Superintendent. I wish to take this opportunity expressing my personal and official thanks to him and all other officers and teachers. Many times we overlook the untiring efforts, efficienty, and devotion or our Church School workers.


Our Methodist Youth Fellowship is doing fine work under the leadership of Miss Beth Kuykendall. We wish to acknowledge with appreciation the fine contribution of our own members and particularly the work of several of the V-12 boys at Duke University. Their report will indicate progress and a deep spiritual interest in the youth of the Church.

The WSCS and the WSG are seeking to touch the lives of the womanhood of our Church and to enlist them in some phase of Missionary or local church activity. Their respective reports will cover their activities and progfess during the Cument Conference Year. I appreciate the cooperation of the leaders in every phase of Church work.

Under the leadership of Ralph C. Barker and the Board of Stewards whe financial aspect of our church work has been efficiently done, but our chairman and the several committees of our Board have been concerned with the Spiritual growth and activities of our church. Several meetings have given large place to evangelism and other important phases of church work. This sympathetic cooperation and intelligent support of our Board has made the work of the pastor more fruitful.

Frank Peery, a Senior at Duke Divinity School, has assumed full leadership of the Intermediate Department and will give assistance to the Junior Department in its recreation and social activities. He will also, through the Youth Council and by personal contact, assist the Youth Fellowship group especially in the field of recreation.

The evangelistic program of the Crusade for Christ will be our program this fall and throughout the coming Conference Year. I measure my words when I state that more hours of work, more careful planning, More earnest prayers have gone into this phase of our work than in any church program we have everyunder-taken. We are being driven to this because of the overwhelming need for a spiritual awakening, not only in our Church but in our City. Never in the history of Christendom has there been a more effective means for the revival of man, and therefore of society than the method of lay evangelism, which is now being used not only throughout our church, but in American Protestantism. This is exactly what the evangelistic program of the Crusade for Christ comprehends. The Year of Evangelism opens this month with a church-wide "Christ"



and Church Loyalty Emphasis." We are seeking to follow this program not only in outline but in spirit. Tomorrow night we will have our instruction dinner for Church visitors. Next Sunday we hope to visit every family connected with our Church for the purpose of making a friendly call, thus promoting Christian fellowship throughout our church. The visitors will also fill in an information card for each family, which will provide information for our use in increasing Sunday School enrollment, enlarging and strengthening the WSCS, WSG, and MYF. We also feel that these friendly visits will be the means of reaching many inactive members in our Church. This program which we are seeking prayerfully and intelligently to carry out will result in a deeper spiritual life for our church, and revitalize religion and a deeper loyalty to the church for all who participate in it.

We shall give first attention to the great command, "Go Ye!", allowing it first place in our church methods and prayers and work. We recognize that our church can have no continued spiritual life unless the boys and girls and youth and adults are actively related to Christ. So we are going out by two's next Sunday afternoon to carry a message of our to every Methodist home.

Other phases of the Year of Evangelism will be emphasized as the year progresses.


Since the last Quarterly Conference we have received 69 members into our church. Of this number 23 were received on Confession of Faith. (See Supplements A, B. and C.)
