## TO THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT AND MEMBERS OF THE FOURTH QUARTERLY CONFERENCE:

The Church Services at Duke Memorial Sunday mornings are well attended. We have the best choir in the city. The pastor has preached 44 Sundays, Rev. B. L. Jones, two Sundays during revival, Dr. H. E. Spence and Dr. A. J. Walton preached one Sunday morning each, and on Laymen's Day Mr. Edwin Jones of Charlotte occupied the pulpit. During the three Sundays the pastor was away on vacation the Junior preacher, B. L. Davidson, Rev. A. D. Gray, of Oxford, and Rev. M. A. Kidder of Chapel Hill, filled the pulpit. This year has been a heavey loss by death. The pastor has conducted 26 funerals, 19 of which were for members of the church. Tomorrow we conduct the funeral of one of our most honored members, Mr. W. P. Henry, Chairman Emeritus of the Board of Stewards.

Eighty new members have joined the Church, 69 have moved membership. The present membership is 1801, net loss of three. By Conference we expect to make up the loss and hope to have a small increase. There are a number of excellent prospects on our lists.

This year we have had 16 weedings and have Christened 15 infants.

In January we moved to 2000 Cedar St., a lovely new parsonage. Each Wednesday night until the membership had all been invited, open house was held at the new home.

The pastor conducted Easter Week Services, and Rev. Barney L. Jones preached the Spring Revival. The pastor preached two out of town revivals, Wake Forest and Leasburg Circuit. The week of visitation was observed with groups of men and women making calls on prospects given in city-wide survey.

Union out-door services were held on Sunday nights, July and August, with Temple Baptist and Congregational Christian Churches participating.

The pastor assisted for several weeks in the Greensboro College building fund drive held in Durham. The Junaluska Banquet was held here and \$1600 was paid by Duke Memorial Members in a \$7000 goal for the District.

Overseas relief offering amounted to \$159.55, Camp Don Lee offering, \$298, and Week of Dedication, \$178. A Youth Week was held with the Rev. W. M. Howard, Jr., of Chapel Hill as the speaker.

Vacation Bible school had an enrollment of 104 children. Three church-wide picnics were held and added much to the fellowship of members.

The new Associate Board of Stewards was installed and is adding much to life of Church. Mr. W. W. Rankin, Jr., is Chairman.

The Wesleyan Service Guild Annual Conference was held here June 24-25 with about 200 delegates. The spiritual life of the church is good, the Sunday night attendance is from 40 to 100.

The Youth of the Church under the direction of Miss Elizabeth Johnson are doing excellent work. Last Friday night at Asbury Church we helped welcome 250 Methodist freshman to Duke University. Duke Memorial has 80 young people in college, the names of whom appeared in our church bulletin last Sunday. The young people have supper every Sunday night at the Church.

Nursery School is being held two days a week at the Church. Representatives have been in attendance at Camps and assemblies and at Lake Junaluska.

The Sunday School is active in all departments. Mr. W. E. Whitford is doing excellent job as our Church School superintendent.

The Woman's Society with part of circles meeting in homes and part at church is doing fine work with Mrs. A. H. Borland as leader.

The Boy Scout unit of Duke Memorial has more Eagle Scouts than all other troops in town combined. I would like to recommend Dr. R. N. Wilson, Scoutmaster, for the man of the years for the work he has done with our youth through Scouting.
