

In addition the Christian Social Relations Committee reports a total of more than \$600.00 given by our membership to various charities.



In November we had a Jurisdictional Study Course on the United Nations taught by Mrs. A.H. Borland. We had four sessions and each one who took the course was richly rewarded for it was an excellent study. The Zone meeting was held at our church on Nov. 9.

Circles 8 and 9 voted to draw names and change personnel at the end of the year just as the day time circles do. We feel that this is a wise move since it will tend to put the emphasis on the general program of the Society and avoid the danger of the circles becoming social groups. In addition we secured a number of new members and made another night circle. The total membership now stands at $\lambda 98$.

Report of Woman's Society of Christian Service of Duke Memorial Church for last quarter ending December 31

Thsi report will cover the highlights of the work of the society from Jan. 1- Dec. 1948, with special emphasis on last quarter.

Jan. 1st., there were 297 mambers on roll. These members were placed in ten separate circles with each having a goal to work toward with much emphasis being placed on spiritual cultivation.

During the year new members have been added.

The society got off to a good start in January with an officer's training day conducted by Mrs. A. H. Borland. Each officer was trained individually, and this was followed by an open discussion concerning the year's work. Each officer, circle chairman, Co-chairman, and many standing committes being present.

Feb. 13, the society joined with the societies of six neighbors churches in the observance of World Day of Prayer. Each society had an active part on the program and about 100 women and pastors were prresent. The collection was approximately \$35.00


The W. W. C. S. of Trinity Church invited our society to study with them in April "World Evangelism." About 34 of our members attended this study course.


The summer study was a Bible course taught by Rev. Leon Couch at St. Paul's Church. Our society average a daily attendance of 22 for the four consecutive days.

The fall study was "America's Georgraphical Frontiers" taught by Mrs. A,H Borland at our church with Lakewood and Bethany participating. The average daily attendance for the four classes was 25 for our society.

Mot much can be said as to our support and cooperation with our supply work which is allocated by the Mission board howerer, we did send hospital supplies to the Phillipines once in Germany, and at present we are cooperating with our pastor in a church wide relief project for the teen age childern in displaced person's camps in Europe, and refuges camps in Asia.

Every officer has done a good job and much has been accomplished, but special mention should bre biven the secretary of Literature and Publication, Mrs. Wallace Lee. From Jan 1, to the date she has secured 65 newewals to the World Outlook and the Methokist Woman, and 123 new subscriptions. Atotal of 188.





Special mention should also be given the Spiritual Life Department with Mrs. C. W. Peppler, Leader. About 20-40 attended these meetings prior to the general meetings. An opportunity is given each person to pray for some specific thing or person. It is in this department that our minds and hearts are refreahed with the desire to work and serve more faithfully and diligently in the work for our Master.

The Society's pledge to conference was \$1500.00. To date \$125.00 of this pledge has been paid.
