

February 4, 1964

The Duke Memorial Methodist Church Official Board met in the Chapel Parler at 7:45 p.m., on February 4, 1964. Dr. John Glasson presided. Mr. Warren Bishop opened the meeting with prayer. The minutes were read, corrected, and approved.

There were no reports from the commissions nor the standing committees. In the absence of the church treasurer and the building fund treasurer, the financial reports were read by Mr. C. H. Chewning. Copies of both reports are attached to these minutes.

Dr. Glasson, reporting for the building committee, stated that the new building was progressing well. Moves concerning the relocation of certain classes in the Church School during the renovation of the present education building are well in hand.

Mr. Bradshaw reported that the building contractor still hopes to have the building completed by June 29.

The following announcements were made by the pastor.

- February 6. District Conference would meet at Concord Methodist Church. Elected laymen from Duke Memorial Church, Mr. John Dozier and Mr. J. H. Coman, would be expected to be present.
- February 20. District Laymen's Rally dinner meeting would be held at the Civic Center. Tickets for the dinner would be \$1.50 and Mr. R. C. White would be in charge of the sale. The pastor expressed a desire for good attendance from our church this year.
- February 12, 19. A study course entitled "Our Missions Today", would be conducted during the hour usually set aside for prayer meeting. March 4 and 11. During these four Wednesday nights we would be thinking together about our missions in the churches today.
- February 26. Our pastor will be the guest speaker at St. Philips Episcopal Church. Anyone from his congregation who wished to attend may do so.

Mr. Bradshaw read two articles which he thought might be of interest to the Board. The first entitled, "What Does A Pastor Do". The second, which was presented several years ago by one of the speakers at a Duke Convocation, was entitled, "What We As A Church Are Trying To Do". Both articles tended to lean toward the happenings in our church life today which seem to dwell on everything but the study of Jesus Christ. He suggested that this might be food for thought.

There being no further business the meeting was dismissed with prayer by Mr. Bradshaw.
