

January 31, 1933.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Holton in the absence of the chairman. Jay Phillips lead in prayer. The minutes were read by the secretary and approved.

The following teachers were elected upon nomination of Mr. Holton, general superintendent:

Ruth Bowman, in the Intermediate Department.

Mrs. C.G. Maxwell, Counselor Senior Department.

Mrs. J.G. Baldwin, teacher Senior Department.

Mrs. R.M. Copper, assistant teacher Senior Department.

It was announced that Miss Lillie Duke's class had assumed the responsibility for the Senior Department as a class project, and that a committee from the class was to look after it. The Board wished to express its appreciation to the class, which it did later in the Workers' Council.

On the question of the Missionary Cultivation period it was reported that a committee had been appointed, and that they had decided to try to begin about six weeks before Easter, and let it culminate at the Easter season.

Jay Phillips reported that the Junior Congregation was getting along nicely, and that the numbers in attendance was steadily increasing

Prof. Wilson reported that his class in the Young People's Department was gradually increasing and that he was still at work on getting in more boys. He also reported that younger boys were being added to the Scout troupe as fast as they could be handled. The enrollment of the local troupe was about 30, but very few were members of this church. He explained something of the nature of

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the work and about the 10-year plan that had been adopted by the state scout workers. The superintendent asked that he turn in a roll of his members to the secretary of the Board and he said he would do it right away.

Mrs. Green reported that the children's work was getting along very nicely, but that they were having trouble with children coming in so late that they missed the class periods altogether and were not marked present. It was thought best to try to appeal to the mothers and fathers in the adult classes who came late and thus made their children late.

Mr. Holton welcomed Mrs. Brian as a new member to our Board and expressed his appreciation that she could be there and give us her counsel and advice.

The meeting then adjourned to the Workers' Council supper.
