

August 20, 1959

The Commission On Education met on August 17, 1959, at 7:30, with Mr. John Perian presiding. Mr. Shoaf was asked to open the meeting with prayer.

The minutes were read and corrected.

Mr. Perian asked for reports from the superintendents. Mrs. Bookhout brought up the need for a second helper in the 2 year nursery during the church hour; Mr. Tom Coble stated that there are possibilities of work with adult classes but there are no present problems, that the college class attendance varies.

Mrs. George Kale stated that some pianos were in poor condition and recommended that the pianos be repaired. A motion was made by Mrs. Bookhout and seconded by Mr. Coble that the Commission offer the following recommendation to the Official Board:

All pianos which have not been tuned or repaired within the past year be put in good order and then proper upkeep be maintained on an annual basis.

The motion was carried. Mr. Perian will present the recommendation to the Official Board.

Mr. Shoaf Discussed responsibilities of the Commission. He said that we need to revamp the leadership program to increase its effect; the whole Youth Program needs support; the Older People need a ministry that is not supplied.

He brought up the need for certain committees:

1. The Day School Committee is continuing.
2. A Family Night Committee should meet soon.
3. A Library Committee.
4. A new Leadership Committee. The Leadership Committee should be composed of the superintendents plus about the same number of elected members. The committee should find, recruit, and train for service and in service.

Chairman Perian mentioned the need of a functioning Adult Council. Prof. Wilson wishes to have instruction on the physical and mental damage of the use of alcoholic drinks carried out as a study by the young people later.

The meeting was adjourned.

The Committee on Education met on March 10, 1955, at 7:30 p.m. in the Board Room. Mr. Tolson presided. Mr. Boardman acted as secretary.

The minutes were read and corrected.

Mr. Boardman asked for reports from the subcommittees. Mr. Boardman reported on the need for a second year in law school. Mr. Tolson stated that there was no possibility of going with the first year and that no present problems, but the college of law attendance was low.

Mr. Boardman stated that some changes were being considered and recommended that the plan be approved. Another was made by Mr. Boardman and approved by Mr. Tolson. The Committee then approved the following recommendations to the Official Board:

All changes which have not been made or repeated within the next year be put in good order and then approved by the Board. Mr. Tolson will present the recommendations to the Official Board.

Mr. Tolson stated that the responsibility of the Committee is to see that we have the best possible program for increasing the number of people who are interested in the law. The Official Board is not called.

He brought up the need for certain committees:

1. The Law School Committee is continuing.
2. A Public Affairs Committee should meet soon.
3. A Library Committee.
4. A new Academic Committee. The Academic Committee should be composed of the representatives of the law schools and the number of people interested. The Committee should find a way to bring the law to the people.

Chairman Boardman mentioned the need of a functioning committee. Mr. Tolson stated that he had a suggestion on the physical and mental health of the law of scientific thinking carried out as a study by the young people today.

The meeting was adjourned.
