The Commission on Education met December 16, 1957 with the following members present: Mr. Allen, Mr. Angier, Mrs. Aydlett, Mrs. Bookout, Mr. Chewning, Miss Glass, Miss Johnson, Rev. Queen, Rev Shoaf, Mr. Umstead, Mr. Whitford.

It was reported that Intermediate Department repairs are undone. Official Board has not yet approved 5th year kindergarten repairs because of Quarterly Conference instead of regular Official Board meeting.

Open house was held in Children's Division. Shoaf reported good work in Children's Division.

Youth Departemnt - library nook is done. Mrs. Brinkley helps in Intermediate Department. Mr. Whitford moved, Allen seconded that basketball teams be approved and bills paid.

Mr. Whitford moved that entire list of church school teachers be published in bulletin at beginning of next quarter. Passed.

Adult Division - Two meetings of adult council have been held. There is no adult superintendent yet.

Six Boy Scouts have made application for God and Country award.

In response to Dr. Kale's question - Will Duke Memorial take approximately four of his students to help in church school during spring semester? Chewning moved, Whitford seconded that we would be glad to use as many students as we can place. Passed.

Mission Study program for Senior and Intermediate MYF will be on Japan.

Mr. Allen moved that family nights be held as often as we can. January or early February date tentative.

Mr. Whitford moved, Bookout seconded that one person ^{from this area.} plus someone from other group be on committee for this family night.

Themes suggested for future family night programs were:

1. Family night on Mission theme.
2. Home and church working together
3. New church members
4. Stewardship cultivation

Leadership training class committee will complete scanning church roll by January 1st for possible members of training class. Each Commission member and leadership training committee members will visit prospects for class. First class will be held 3rd Sunday in January.

Church membership class begins first Saturday in January.
