

January 19, 1959

The Commission on Education met January 19, 1959 with Chr. Holton presiding.

Mr. Allen stated that ^{the} youth department is doing as well as usual. Older youth class seems to be doing little better than in the past. Mr. Forrester is teaching Tom Cranford's class at the present time. Attempt is being made to overcome noise in the halls by the intermediates.

Mr. Whitford is pleased by the attendance in spite of the weather. The collections are holding **up** and very gratifying. The new married couples class is working for new members constantly according to inquiries from various members of that class. The attendance and collection reports for this class are a little irregular.

Mr. Whitford reported that he gave report to official board about findings of space committee and that group has authorized a committee to work on this.

Mr. Shoaf has on hand papers about possible Girl Scout troops and is planning to attend next Scout Council meeting.

Mr. Whitford will look into the matter of funds the former Associate Board had planned for use in the nursery.

Eleven people are attending the leadership group at this time. The advanced class has about seven interested recruits but follow-up recruiting needs to be done.

It was the opinion of the group that worship hour nursery workers' funds need to be reallocated for three paid workers. Mr. Shoaf will recruit volunteer help.

Pianos are needed - one in the Fellowship Hall. Mrs. Bookhout moved, Mr. Perian seconded that Mr. Shoaf use his discretion on buying three chalk boards.

Durham Area Christian Workers' School will be held Feb. 15-23 at Calvary Methodist Church. Mr. Whitford moved, Mr. Bradshaw seconded that this church pay its apportioned part for this school.

The budget committee composed of Shoaf, Whitford, and Holton will meet soon.

Mr. Bradshaw dismissed the meeting with prayer.
