

May 16, 1959

The Commission on Education met May 18, 1959 with Chairman Holton presiding. Mr. Whitford reported that Church School attendance is good and, except for some leadership vacancies, everything is doing well.

It was reported that the painting under the renovation program is disappointing. Cabinets are not yet finished. Space committee has not met.

Mr. Whitford moved, Mr. Perian seconded that we accept the baby grand piano for Duke Memorial Church from Mrs. Bookhout. Approved. The secretary was instructed to write a letter thanking Mrs. Bookhout for her gracious thought.

Mr. Shoaf reported that he is continuing to receive reports on the general study of the church school. Slowly, but surely, progress is being made.

Mr. Shoaf moved, Mr. Perian seconded that the following teachers be approved for the day school staff: Mrs. Pittman, Mrs. Upchurch and Mrs. Howard. Approved.

Mr. Whitford moved, Mr. Perian seconded that we approve the following teachers for the church school: Mrs. Marshall Spears to replace Mrs. Cox in the 4th year kindergarten, Mrs. Ervin for the 6th grade class, and Mrs. Christmas. Approved.

Additional teachers are needed in 4th, 6th and 7th grades.

Five persons are attending the Leadership Training class. Two are acting as apprentices in the church school.

Vacation Church school will be held July 20-31. Letters will be sent to members to indicate their willingness to help.

It was the opinion of the group that Mark Dustin not be given a key to the basement to work out acrobatic program.

Randy Marshall's interest in God and Country program at Epworth Church was discussed. Mr. Shoaf will talk with Randy about this.

It was announced that John Perian was elected chairman of this Commission at the last Quarterly Conference. New members of this Commission will be invited to the next regular meeting June 15.
