MINUTES
COMMISSION ON EDUCATION

The regular meeting of the Commission on Education of Duke Memorial Church was held Friday, July 17, in the Church Parlor, with six members present: S. J. Angier, Mrs. T. S. Coble, Jr., Jane Perry, R. N. Wilson, Elizabeth Johnson, and Kathleene Cox.

The meeting was opened with prayer by Mr. Angier. Miss Johnson presided in the absence of the Chairman.

Mrs. Coble reported that new Cokesbury hymnals had been purchased for the Anchor Class.

The treasurer reported a balance of \$1331.24 as of June 1.

A motion was made and carried that the money for incidentals (\$7.00 per month per department) for the four-year kindergarten and intermediates be caught up, and then continued by the month as in other department. By some oversight these two groups have not been receiving their allotment.

Mr. Wilson reported that two boys, Larry Stevens, and Shields Harvey, were attending the National Jamboree in California; that a mountain trip was planned for the scouts the last week in August. He stated also that special care would necessarily have to be taken in selection of members for the scout troop, that there would be a letter to the parents, as well as an interview with them, in order that the parents as well as the boys understand about the work and what is expected of them.

Jane Perry reported that the Youth Activities Week had been very successful and helpful; that other than this the young people had had two delightful week--ends at Camp Don-Lee; and had been in charge of one evening church service. It was also stated that the young people would lead one of the worship services of the subdistrict Youth Activities Week to be held at St. Paul Church, Durham.
