

The Duke Memorial Board of Christian Education met on October 24 with the following members present: Miss Williams, Mrs. Lee, Mrs. Rankin, Mr. Boddie, Mr. Windham, Mr. Umstead, Dr. Bookhout, Miss Johnson, Dr. Seeley, and Miss Canada.

It was voted to request the pastor to have the installation of stewards and the officers of the church school at the same time.

Alice Rankin reported that the Sunday School hour on the radio was held and was good.

Starting the church school at 9:30 is working out well. All classes except the Pastor's Aides are cooperating. Mr. Boddie said that he may try a song service with them so that they will come earlier.

Alice Rankin reported that the new Career class has 11 members, with Sam Holton as teacher. The Anchor Class and the Harry C. Smith Class need teachers. Board members suggested various people to her.

A discussion of the use of the Ladies Parlor for the Kindergarten children ensued. No one has refused to allow the Parlor to be used for the children, but it is perfectly apparent that the Parlor will never be a children's room. The Board suggested that the Anchor Class be asked to consider using the Parlor for their meetings and give their class room to the children. It was then voted to do this if it meets with the approval of the Anchor Class. The YAF will also use the Parlor for their assemblies. The vote also carried the proviso that this be done as soon as possible.

Mrs. Pittman has been appointed assistant teacher for the day nursery.

Miss Johnson reported that several religious education majors have been appointed to our church. Miss Mary Williams and Mr. Joe Zink are working with the Intermediates. Miss Williams is also doing an excellent job of leading the singing. Mrs. Zunas has also been coming, but has not received a definite assignment yet.

On Sept. 14, 15, 16 Miss DesJardins was here for a weekend workshop for Intermediates. The church is greatly indebted to the General Board, Editorial Division, for making her available for a most profitable time for all.

Mr. Umstead reported that the average attendance was 513 last year. So far this year it is only 500. First three quarters of last year were good, but the last quarter was terrible. Mr. Umstead was asked to report by quarters for both years at the next meeting.

A committee consisting of Miss Johnson, Mrs. Gates, Mrs. Lee was appointed to decide on a church wide Christmas service project. It was voted also to use the family service for Christmas and to emphasize this in all classes.

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After some discussion the Board decided to emphasize the Orphanage for Thanksgiving. The idea was to train the children in stewardship as well as help the Orphanage. The offering is to be a sacrificial one with envelopes provided for each child. There will be a space on it to put the things given up: a coca cola, ice cream cone, movie, etc. On Sunday the 18th these will be tallied up as a certian number of movies, coca colas, etc. Bill Rankin was appointed to head up this committee for the entire church.

It was suggested again that there is need for a telephone outside of the offices; this would be necessary in event of emergencies when the offices are locked. No action was taken.

The meeting closed with a discussion of the suggestion that an executive **committee** of the board be appointed to deal with routine matters. The purpose of this would be to free the board for ~~discussion~~ long range planning. It was suggested that we think of this until the next meeting.

The meeting was closed with prayer.
