

April 2, 1935

The meeting was opened with prayer by the pastor, after which the minutes were read and approved.

There was no regular report from the Junior Church Committee, as the members had not gotten together on the matter. The chairman asked that a special report be ready by the next meeting.

In connection with the work of the Junior Church and other activities of the church Mr. Smith brought up the question of a regular paid helper in the church who would combine the places of those we now have and be a fulltime assistant to the pastor. No action was taken but after a little discussion the pastor asked the members of the Board to be thinking the matter over for further consideration.

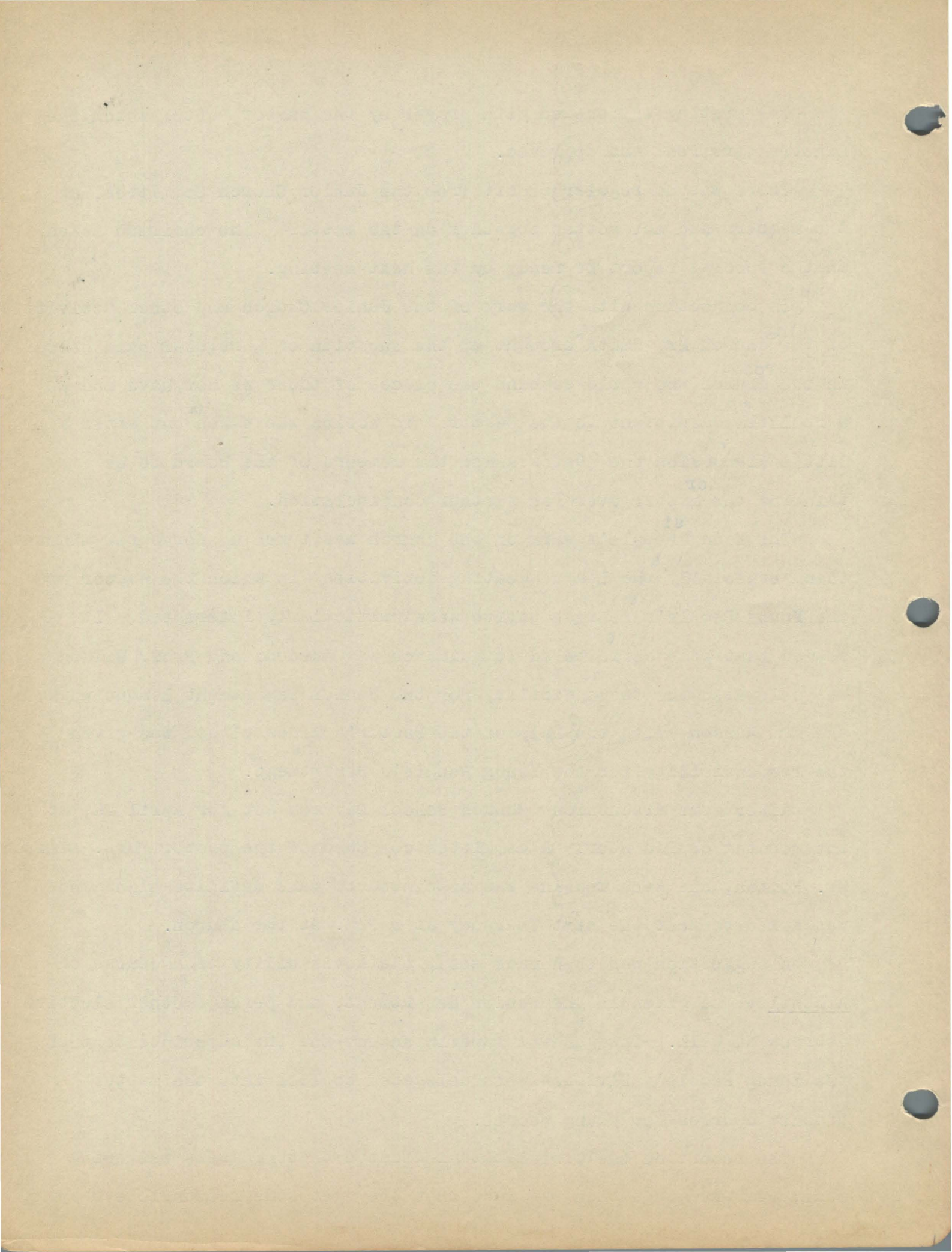
The Young People's work of the church was taken up for a few minutes then, especially the League meeting activities in which the pastor and the Young People's representative were particularly interested. It seemed that some definite adult guidance was needed; and Prof. Wilson was delegated the responsibility for the Senior Department League work, and Mr. Ranson, with the help of the Pastor's Aides class, was given the responsibility for the Young People's Department.

After some discussion, Church School Day was set for April 28, at the morning church hour. A committee composed of the pastor, Mrs. Allison Mr. Holton, and Reba Cousins was appointed to make definite plans and was asked to meet the next Thursday at 5 P.M. at the church.

A suggestion was then made about the advisability of a course on Alcohol to be given in the Senior department, and perhaps other elective courses as well. The general superintendent and the superintendent of the Young People's Division were delegated to look into the matter of unit courses for young people.

The report on the Girl Scouts indicated that progress was being made, and the suggestion was made that they get some responsible backing







and a troop committee. The same committee appointed on the question some time before was continued, with the responsibility of keeping up the interest and work of the troop.

The question of worship in the adult division was raised, especially in regard to the duplication of worship programs for practically all groups concerned. After some discussion it was referred to the Adult Council to see about doing away with departmental worship altogether, letting the class programs and the regular church service function for the purpose.

Prof. Wilson reported that the Boy Scouts were showing a good bit of activity and progress, and that they made a good record at the Court of Honor. The question of cubbing was still up, and more and more great possibilities seem to be in evidence for it, but no definite plans as yet have been made.

The pastor then brought up the baptismal service for children on Easter Sunday afternoon, and Mrs. Paschall was asked to help look after getting the babies lined up for it.

The question of a Vacation School was brought up, and Mrs. Wade's class on the campus was suggested as a good place for leaders and prospective leaders to get information concerning it. No action was taken at this time.

A report was made by the pastor of the meeting held with the Junior and Intermediate teachers concerning boys and girls not members of the church. The co-operation of the Board was asked in helping to get others not members of the church ready for membership by Easter.

It was then decided that the next meeting was to be with a Workers' Council Supper on April 30. Mrs. Ormond was asked to get one of the circles to serve the supper.

There being no further business the meeting was then adjourned.
