The question of the preparation of children for church membership leading up to the Easter program was then taken up. It was suggested and decided to do this through the departments in co-operation with the pastor, and that he would visit both the Junior and Intermediate Departments some during the month. It was emphasized that the work be carried on both through the department program and through the teachers of the individual classes.
