

April 19, 1938.

On Tuesday afternoon, April 19, just prior to the Workers' Council supper, the Board of Christian Education met in the Pastor's Study. The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Allen reported on the action being taken to form a class composed of young married people. Since it seemed impracticable to develop such a group using Mr. Seeley's present class as a nucleus, a committee composed of A. A. Long, Russell Ranson, Mrs. A. H. Borland, ^{Easter} ~~Mr.~~ Smith, and A. J. Knight, was appointed to organize the class. Through canvassing and personal contacts made by those on the committee, the number attending the Sunday morning meetings is gradually increasing. As yet no one has been asked to teach the class regularly.

Professor Wilson reported that he expected to have about twenty boys in his scout troupe after re-registration this month. Gerald Cooper plans to help him with the activities beginning in May.

For six weeks before Easter, Mr. Smith reported, he met a class of boys and girls who joined the church on Palm Sunday.

Mr. Allen expressed gratification at the way in which the Young People's Department has moved forward. Both interest and attendance have increased in the last few years.

Mr. Allen reported that the average attendance for the last month was approximately 525 a Sunday. He estimated that during a given month from 750 to 800 different people attended Sunday School. The enrollment is about 900. The offerings showed a tendency upward during March and April, in March the average collections being approximately \$21 per Sunday.

The meeting was adjourned ^{with benediction} by the pastor.
