

February 19, 1940.

The Board of Christian Education met in the Pastor's Study at five o'clock. The meeting was called to order by Mr. Holton, chairman, and prayer was offered by the Pastor.

The minutes were read and approved.

The following were elected to fill vacancies in the Junior Department:

Superintendent - Sidney R. Crumpton

Mrs. T. E. Allen, Jr. - Teacher to replace Mr. Crumpton

Miss Ruth Conine - Teacher to replace Mrs. Nicholson

Miss Jean Boyle - Teacher to replace Mrs. Spence

At the request of Mrs. Smith, speaking on behalf of the Social Relations Committee of the Missionary Society, the Board voted to include in the curriculum of the Vacation Bible School a course on temperance, this to be primarily for the children in the Junior Department.

Mr. Crumpton reported progress in the Junior Department. Easter being just a few weeks off, programs were planned stressing church membership, particularly for the benefit of those who intended to join the church.

The superintendents of the various departments were asked by Mr. Allen for a report on the success of the visitation done by their teachers and the effort being made to keep in touch with absent members. In most cases, few visits had been made because of the lack of time on the part of the teachers. However, cards were being sent to absentees.

The next Workers' Council meeting was announced for Monday evening, February 26, at 7:30. Instead of the usual dinner meeting, a devotional service of about thirty minutes in length, led by the Pastor, was planned. Following this, those present would go into divisional group meetings for short sessions to discuss matters affecting their particular work, the divisional superintendent to act as chairman of each group.

Mr. Allen called the attention of the Board to the basketball team which



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had been sponsored by the Men's Bible Class. It played regularly during the winter months, and there were about fifteen participating. The expenses connected therewith were handled by a committee from the class appointed by Mr. Allen.

April 21 was designated as Church School Day. On recommendation of the Pastor, a committee, composed of Mr. Allen, chairman, Mr. Crumpton and Mrs. Green, was appointed by Mr. Holton to make suggestions to the council as to the type of Church School Day program to be undertaken for the spring.

Mr. Allen suggested that a list of the superintendents and teachers of the various departments be given on the back of the Sunday service program from time to time.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
