

January 23, 1942.

The Board of Christian Education met in the Pastor's Study on Friday, January 23, at 5:30 p.m., the chairman, Dr. Holland Holton, presiding. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The following changes and appointments in the personnel of the Church School teaching staff were recommended and approved: Mrs. H. C. Smith, teacher for Mrs. Dickson's class instead of B. W. O'Neal; Tommy Hobbs, teacher of second year Junior boys; Louise Smith, teacher of third year Junior girls; Sarah Taylor, transferred from the Intermediate to Primary Department as pianist.

Professor Wilson nominated Dr. Joseph McCracken for assistant scout master. The nomination was seconded by Mr. Allen and approved by the Board.

A regular teacher training class as a part of the program for the Church School was suggested by Mr. Lentz. Discussion followed as to the advisability of this course of study being taken up by the Young Adult Class. Dr. Holton appointed a committee, consisting of Dr. Proctor, Mr. England and Mr. Lentz, to work out a satisfactory schedule for such a class.

Looking toward the Easter program, Mr. Lentz asked that the various departments work among the non-church members of their classes in an effort to interest them in joining the church at that time.

Mr. Lentz reported that as of the first of the year all bills for the Church School had been paid, leaving a balance of \$23.15 in the treasury.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned, the members being invited to attend the dinner of the Workers' Council immediately following.
