

September 28, 1942.

On Monday, September 28, at 5:00 p.m., the Board of Christian Education met in the Pastor's Study, with the Chairman, Dr. Holland Holton, presiding. Following the prayer by the Pastor, the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved. The Chairman requested the secretary to incorporate in the minutes for the April 17 meeting the names of those receiving Church Service Certificates for 1941, which was the first year such awards were made.

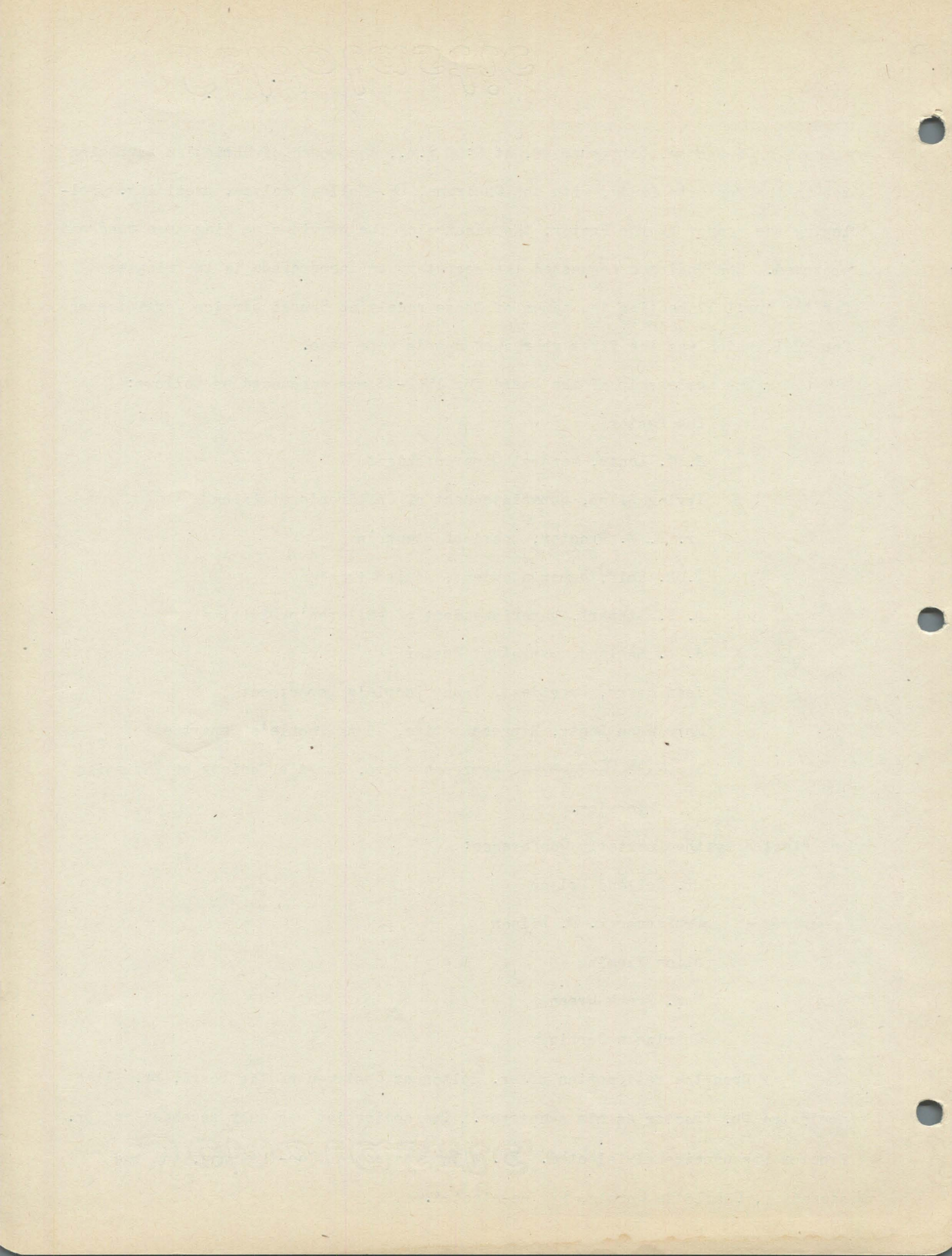

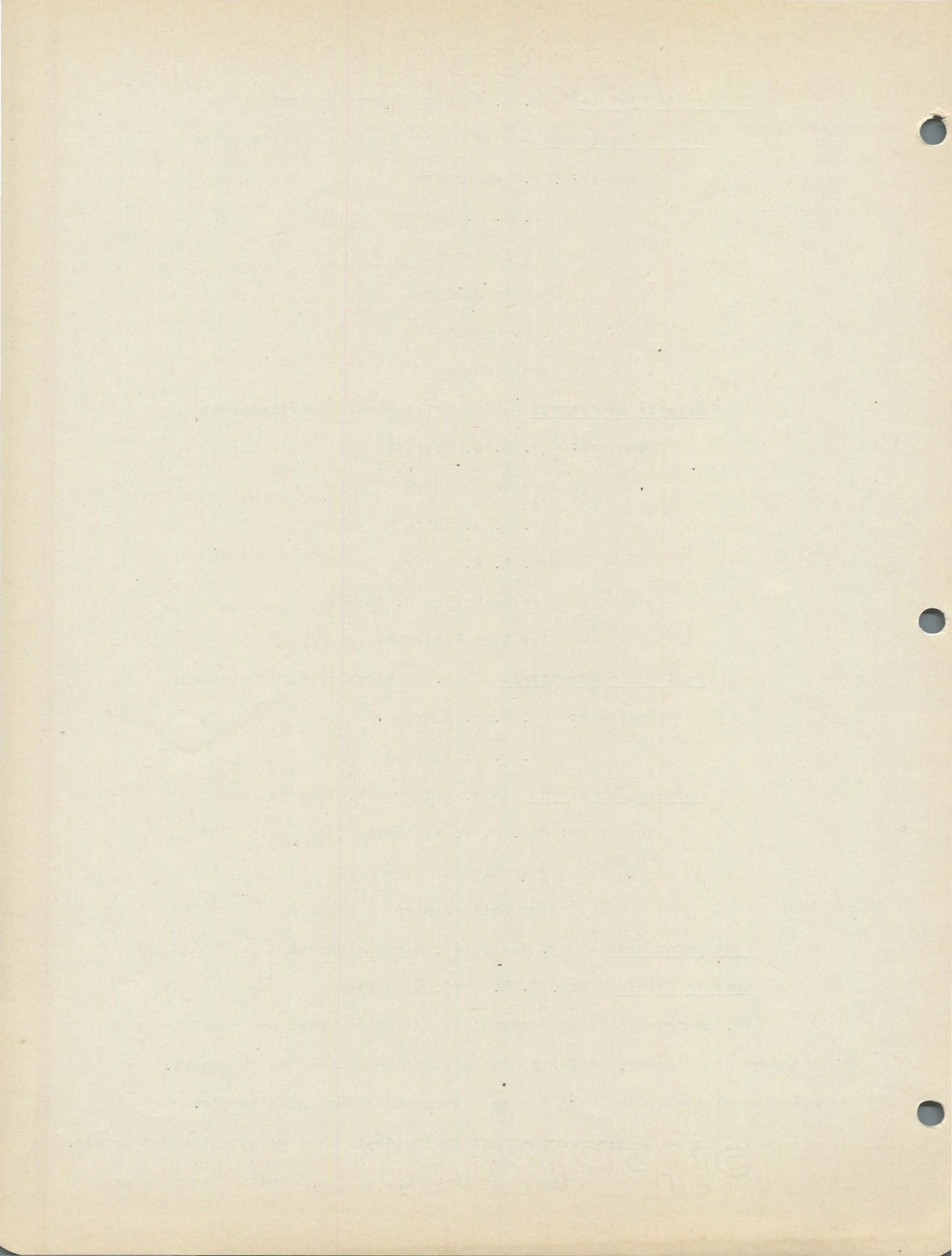

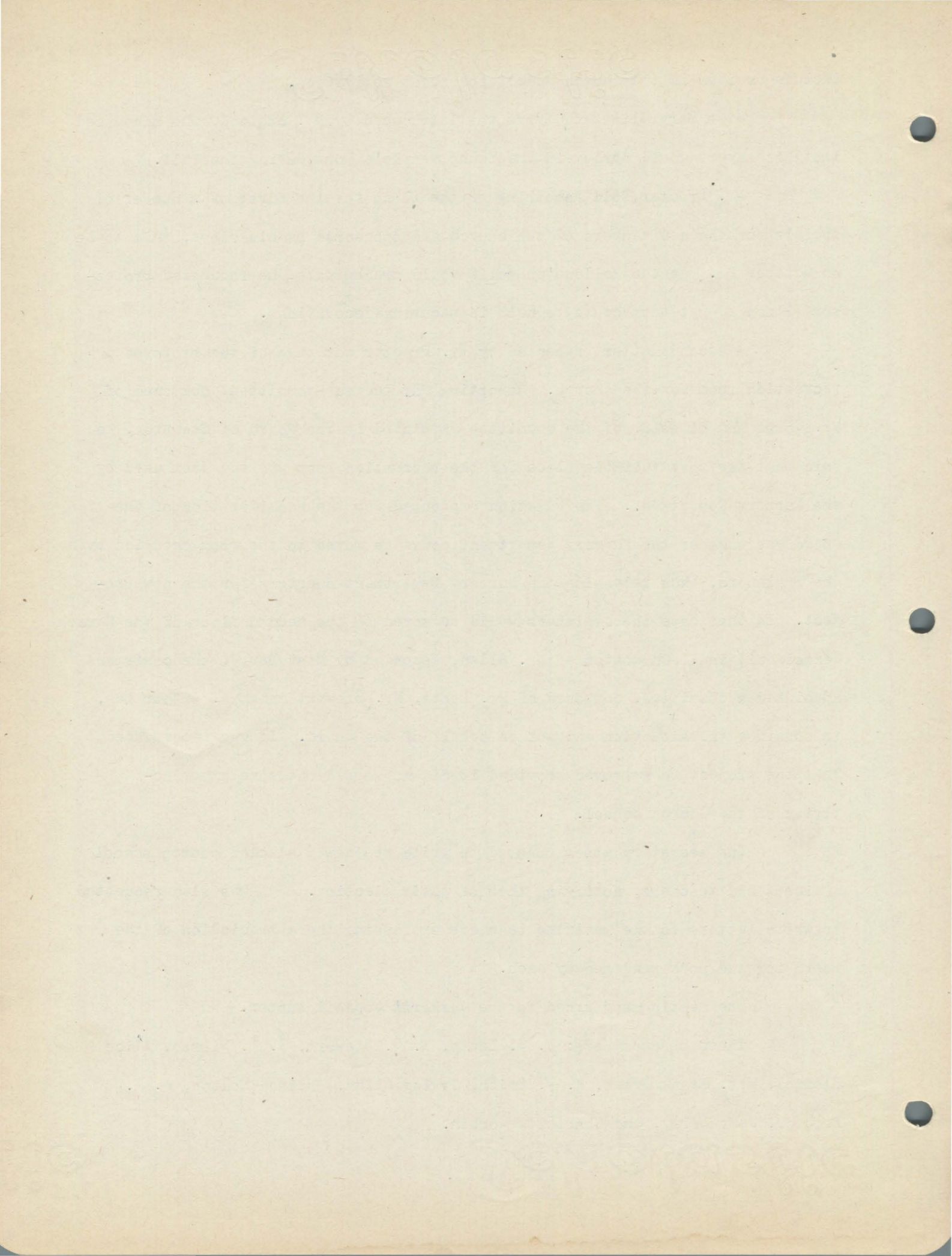

Mr. Lentz urged those present to assist in every way possible in the building up of interest, activity, and attendance in the Church School. He stressed particularly the need for such work among the young people.

Professor Wilson reported on the continued good work of the Boy Scouts. He said that the troupe committee would probably ask the Board of Stewards to





include an item in the church budget for scout activities.

Miss Mary Elizabeth Myers was introduced by Mr. England, who announced that Miss Myers would assist in the Young People's work during the fall.

Dr. Proctor told something of the plans for the first of a number of socials for the new members of the church and sponsored by his class, this to be on October 23. As the Hallowe'en motif would predominate, he requested Professor Wilson to get the scouts to help in securing decorations.

A second matter presented by Dr. Proctor was that of the proposed recreation room for the church. Reporting for the sub-committee, composed of Mr. Coman and himself, of the committee appointed by the Board of Stewards, he said that the most suitable place for the recreation room was the room used by the Nursery Department. The question presented for the consideration of the Board was whether the Nursery Department could be moved to the room occupied by the Beginners, thus releasing the Nursery Department quarters for the new project. In that case the beginners would be moved to the second floor of the Church School building. On motion of Mr. Allen, seconded by Miss Berry, the chairman appointed a committee, composed of Mr. Lentz, Mr. Stewart and Mrs. Arthur Lee, to consider the situation and act on behalf of the Board. It was recommended that the project be approved provided it did not crowd out some other activity of the Church School.

The secretary was requested to write the newly elected church school officers and teachers, notifying them of their election. She was also requested to write letters to the retiring teachers expressing the appreciation of the Board for the work rendered by each.

The meeting adjourned to the Workers' Council supper.
