

March 6, 1944.

On Monday evening, March 6, at 7:30, the Board of Christian Education of Duke Memorial Church held its regular meeting in the Church Parlor. Dr. A. M. Proctor, chairman, presided.

Following prayer by Professor Wilson, the secretary read the minutes of the previous meeting.

Mr. Lentz gave his report for the month of February, pointing out that the average attendance and collection ran about like that for the same period of the previous year. He called particular attention to the increased attendance at Church School on the first Sunday in March, this being due principally to the concentrated work carried on during the week of the Bishop's Crusade, February 27 to March 4. In the absence of the treasurer, Mr. Lentz submitted his report for the approval of the Board.

There was considerable discussion among the members present of the problem of securing teachers for the Church School. This, all agreed, was a serious problem which needed the careful attention of the leaders of the school.

Because the Scout Troop Committee had not had an opportunity to meet since the last meeting of the Board, Professor Wilson asked that the report which he was to have made be deferred.

Reporting on Decision and Rally Day, Mr. Lentz announced the date of the former as March 19, at which time the intermediates and juniors would be led in a joint devotion by Dr. Glenn. April 2 was set aside as Rally Day, and Dr. Ray C. Petry was announced as the speaker for that occasion. On motion by Mr. Lentz, seconded by Professor Wilson, the Board voted that the full collection of the Sunday School for the first Sunday in April, Rally Day, go to the Conference Board of Education. It was suggested that a special announcement be made the last Sunday in March to the effect that this offering would be made.





There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned with prayer by the pastor.
