suggested by the committee and that the class has suggested

Mr. Whitford reported that several teachers are needed in the Primary and Junior Departments, another teacher and a pianist in the Intermediate Department, and Mrs. Lee said that she has lost two teachers. Mrs. Formester and Mr. Mansfield were suggested as teachers for the Intermediates.

Lawrence, and Celia Thompson were suggested as teachers for
Mrs. Lee's group.

According to Mr. Allen the Intermediates now have new song books thanks to Mr. Forrester and the Church School.

Mrs. Lee suggested that our church should be represented at Junaluska and that plans be made in the near future for this.

Mrs. Hook reported that four printer's mats for the Advance for Christ have been purchased and will be used in the bulletins during February and March. She also suggested that the pamphlet "Teaching for a verdict" be ordered by Miss Johnson and distributed to teachers during February and March. It was so voted. Mrs. Hook has made a list of those in the Intermediate and Young People's Department who are not members of the church.

Mr. Brown reported that February 13 is race relations

Sunday and he plans to emphasize this subject in his sermon.

The Board gave Mrs. Hook a standing vote in appreciation for the diligence and faithfulness which she has rendered. We have profited much by her presence.
