Dr. John Glasson, who presided over the meeting, its purpose was to give further consideration to the reinstatement of General Holsinger under the former arrangement. The Chairman remarked that his action in calling the meeting had been prompted by a request made by a prominent church member that the general's services be retained for another year and that the member would increase his pledge by \$300.00 with the indefinite assurance that approximately seven other members would make a similar increase. During the discussion that followed, it was mentioned by Mr. McLean the fact that any action on our part should await the final outcome of the Every Member Canvass which had not been satisfactorily completed. It was the final consensus of opinion expressed by those present, however, that Dr. Glasson should explain to the church member all aspects of the situation, and that although the member's interest in the matter was sincerely appreciated, the Commission was of the opinion that it would be unwise to make changes in the budget which has already been approved and adopted by the official board and that our original decision should not be altered.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was, upon motion, adjourned.
