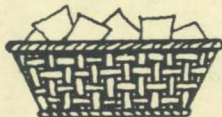

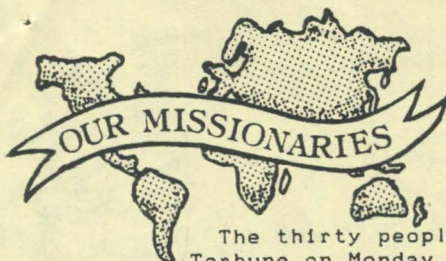

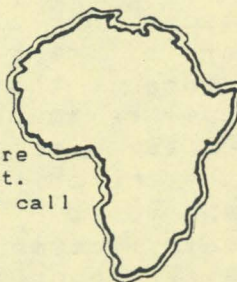

Since 1980, the United Methodist Church has been involved in a unique partnership with African and European Methodist Churches called Africa Church Growth and Development (ACG&D).

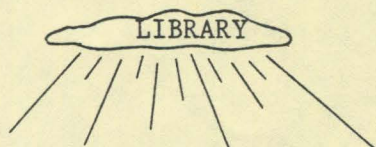

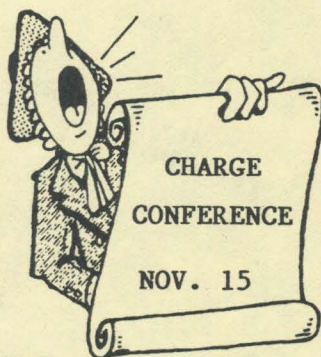

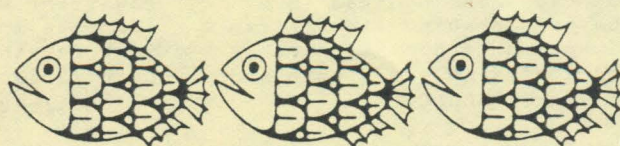
Children will robe during Sunday School and go to the Sanctuary to sit together down front at 10:55.

CARE



For the past months, several members of the Education Work Area and staff have been working to upgrade the childcare program here at the church. While all problems in this area are never solved permanently, some progress has been made:

- new care givers have been employed
- new equipment has been purchased; older equipment has been repaired or discarded
- new childcare settings have been arranged; childcare is more readily available during scheduled events
- additional volunteers have been recruited.

HOWEVER, there are still improvements to be made. HERE'S HOW YOU CAN HELP!

1. Volunteer care givers should arrive promptly:

9:30 a.m. for Sunday school
10:45 a.m. for Worship

Other care givers need to be able to leave so that they can attend worship.

2. We are always trying to broaden our list of volunteer care givers. Please contact Marge Clark or Para Drake for details.

3. Childcare is provided:

9:45 a.m. - 12:15 p.m.
Infants - 24 months Room 241
10:45 a.m. - 12:15 p.m.
Two - Four Years Room 245

Children in Kindergarten or older should attend worship.

Children K-3 can participate in the Junior Church Program.

PLEASE do not put our care givers in an awkward spot by asking them to care for your older child.

4. Sunday morning childcare is provided for parents who are attending Sunday School and/or worship.

Each year about 1250 volunteers work for the programs sponsored by the Durham Congregations in Action (DCIA). Durham raised \$52,000 last year in the CROP WALK. \$4300 was given to Meals on Wheels, Soup Kitchen and Durham Mission Society. Volunteers have saved this community \$500,000+ in services to those in need.

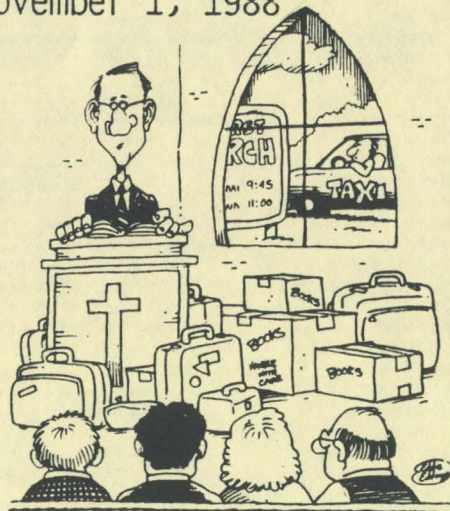
