ALL ABOUT?

A French priest says it actually happened to him. An armed robber accosted him on a dark back street in Paris and demanded his wallet. As the priest opened his coast to reach for his wallet, the thief caught sight of the clerical collar for the first time and immediately apologized, "Never mind, Father, I didn't realize you were a priest -- I'll be on my way." The priest was relieved, of course, and good naturedly offered the man a cigar. "No, thank you, Father," the robber said. "I gave up smoking for Lent."

Obviously that hold-up man did not get the whole picture in whatever catechetical instruction he received!

What is the whole picture? The word "lent is derived from the Anglo-Saxon, lenten, meaning days of spring. In the early church, however, Lent became identified with the forty days between Ash Wednesday and Easter Day. It was a time for study and prayer as new converts prepared for baptism on Easter Day.

Many Christians today continue to use Lent as an occasion for special discipline - for abstinence, alms giving and acts of devotion. I hope that this Lenten Season will be special for each one of us as we remember again the events surrounding the trial, crucifixion and resurrection of our Lord.




IN ACTION




