

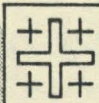

Our treasurer, Charlotte Corbin, has sent \$332.14 from UMW Circles to the District for Prayer and Self-denial, which will go for children and youth missions.

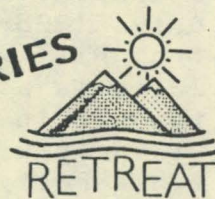

In addition to maintaining a schedule of U.S. concert engagements, radio and T.V. broadcasts, Dudley Oakes performs

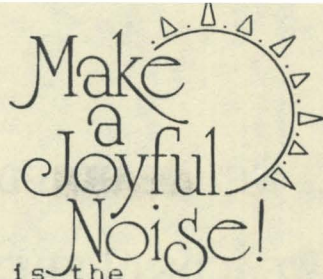

WHEN A FAMILY LEAVES THE GENESIS HOME SHELTER and sets up housekeeping, the Home likes to be able to help them with the basic necessities (blankets, tableware, towels, even furniture).

At the moment the Shelter, itself, has to cover the windows with tablecloths as they have neither drapes nor rods. Only two of their bedrooms have dressers and none have chairs, wastebaskets, or lamp tables. Other items needed include: high chairs, cribs, pictures, carpeting or throw rugs. 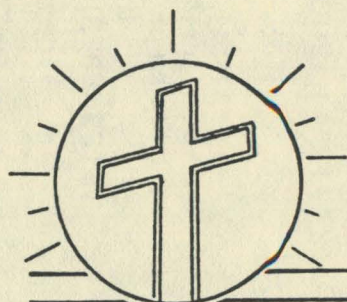
