memorable experiences of my entire ministry was a visit to an UMCOR project in Senegal (West Africa). In an area located in the remote African "bush," UMCOR, through the work of French agriculturist Jean Carbonare, had literally turned a desert into an oasis. In one village an old chief, 99 years of age with dozens of happy, healthy little children around him, said to me "Before you UMCOR and Jean Car-bonare came, our children were hungry and most of them died before they reached their fifth birthday, but you came and now nobody here in our village is hungry, and the children live." 


