"Ed" Smith was not an everyday clergyman, he was an extraordinary one. He was not a typical Methodist, he was a striking one.

Unquestionably he was respected by all who knew him. A Christian man with a sense of humor, who made friends easily and preserved those friendships joyfully, he laughed with many, he lifted many, he loved many.

His full name was unknown to me until I looked it up in the North Carolina Conference Journal after I received the shocking news of his death: Edward Franklin Smith, Jr. But the short form of "Ed" identifies him more accurately.

Note the wide range of his ministry: Maybrook Leasbury... Missionary to the Belgian Congo (ten years)... Hillsborough...Trinity Church, Wilmington...Haymount Church, Fayetteville...Duke Memorial Church, Durham...Chestnut Street Church, Lumberton...Retirement in 1986 after forty years of service.

To countless individuals he has provided a witness that the power of God can be actually realized in a person's experience. It is not something antiquated or elusive in today's world. It is alive, it is real. Through individuals like Ed Smith, God continues to guide, to transform, to heal, to enrich, to bless.

It is of interest that the utilities cost for 1989 as reported by the Church Treasurer were approximately \$7,000 less than budgeted. We cannot say how much of that is directly attributable to the Energy Management System, but certainly, some of it must be.

Sanctuary building renovations are progressing on schedule. As we previously reported, roof leaks must be found and repaired and exterior work such as caulking, leading and pointing must be completed before any interior work can begin. We solicit your patience and promise that the result will be worthwhile.

Edith Toms will chair the Steering Committee for 1990. Their efforts will continue to be directed toward accomplishing the goals set in the campaign on a schedule determined by funds availability.





From Your Lay Leader

LAY PERSON OF THE YEAR

This fall, our District requested nominees for District Lay Person of the Year. The criteria for selection included: (1) activity in local church, (2) activity in local community, (3) job and private life, and

(4) District and Conference service.

Members of our church nominated four outstanding Christian women: Elizabeth Bookhout, Anne Clark, Helen Fink, and Edith Toms. Because of limited space, we can't reprint the nominating letters in their entirety but would like to share these highlights.

Elizabeth Bookhout currently serves as teacher of the Lillie Duke Class, and member of the Steering Committee and Administrative Board. She has served as chairperson of UMW Circle 4, and has been a member of the Board of Trustees, Ad Hoc Committee, and Capital Campaign Committee. Elizabeth visits the Methodist Retirement Home, homebound church members and regularly feeds a paralyzed patient at a local nursing home. She delivers Meals on Wheels. A Laity Day speaker in 1988 & 1989, Elizabeth was involved in Duke Memorial's sponsorship of a Cambodian family some years back. Dr. Elizabeth Bookhout, a former chairperson and Professor Emeritus of the Department of Health, Physical Education and Recreation at Duke University, teaches swimming classes for retired persons. She has held local and state offices in Delta Kappa Gamma. She and her husband, Dr. C. F. Bookhout have two children. Her letter of nomination says it best, "Her whole life is directed toward serving others."

Anne Clark, our new Staff-Parish Relations Committee chairperson, was the first woman to serve on the Board of Trustees at Duke Memorial. She is chairperson of our Weekday School Board of Directors and works on the shut-in committee. A member of Duke Memorial for thirty years, Anne has been UMW secretary, chairperson of the 1987 Every Member Canvass, and secretary to the Administrative Board and the Capital Campaign Committee. She taught the 4 & 5 year old Sunday School class. She worked part-time as the church's financial secretary. Anne is an official with the State Dental Society Auxiliary, works with the Host Homes Program & delivers Meals on Wheels. She is both a past president of the Watts Auxiliary and its Woman of the Year. Anne is married to Dr. C. Fred Clark, is a proud parent and grandparent. Her nomination honors her service and Christian witness.

Quoting Helen Fink's nomination letter: "She always answers in the affirmative to whatever request is made, and for her - nothing is impossible." Active with UMW in a variety of roles, Helen works with the Community Life Center and her Sunday School class. She shares her musical gifts in the Handbell Choir and often plays piano for church groups. Her service to older church members includes running errands, furnishing transportation, helping with income taxes, and visiting the homebound. She recently went to Jamaica to set up a quilting cottage industry to help Jamaican women raise their standard of living. She & husband, Omar, are active in the Cancer Support Group at Duke Medical Center. They share "goodies" and experiences from their many travels. Without listing additional jobs and offices held, Helen clearly demonstrates a lay person dedicated to a Christian life.

Serving as Administrative Board Chairperson in 1988 and 1989. Edith Toms has been a key leader for Duke Memorial. We have completed a major capital funds campaign and subscribed fully the Conference capital campaign. She has most recently agreed to serve as chairperson of the Steering Committee and member of the Program Team. Active in UMW, Edith chaired the Fall Festival Bazaar for two years. She has served on the Finance and Staff-Parish Committees, and as chairperson of the Council on Ministries. Last spring she organized the hospitality for the Bishops' Conference in Raleigh. Her community service includes work with the Junior League, the Debutante Ball Society, and Family Counseling Service of Durham. Edith works with Database, Inc. She is married to Edgar Toms, and has two children, Edgar and Edith. A quote from the letter nominating Edith says, "God bless Edith Toms as she is a blessing to our church and wherever she can serve others."

The selection for District Lay Person of the Year will be announced at the LAY RALLY, Monday, February 5, at the Vance Granville Community College near Henderson. Supper tickets at \$5.50 are available at the door. If you'd like to carpool, meet in the church parking lot at 4:45 p.m. If you'd like to attend the program only (at 7:00 p.m.), meet to carpool at 5:45 p.m.

SAM goes to the movies on Tuesday, February 13. Meet at Lizard Licks restaurant (Guess Road) at 6 p.m.




We'll go to the movies at 7 p.m. at Willowdaile. Dessert afterward will be at Dairy Queen.
