CALLING ALL YOU NEW AND OLD - oops! make that knowledgeable - North Carolinians! Learn or review the history of your state in a fascinating way. Read the Inglis Fletcher novels. Members of the H. E. Spence Bible Class have been collecting these books for our Library and we now have almost a dozen volumes. The latest one given by the Class in memory of Albert Louis Buehler is Raleigh's Eden.

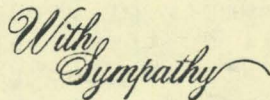


Our Prayer Chain is "on line" and ready to serve you. You can make prayer requests by calling the Church Office or by filling out a prayer request card (in Office and Narthex).



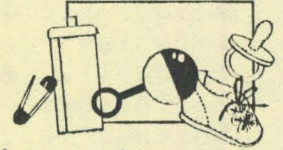

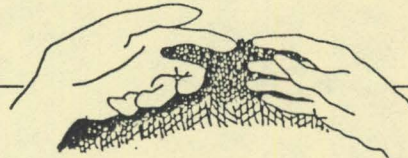

CURIOUS KALEIDOSCOPE PRESENTS:

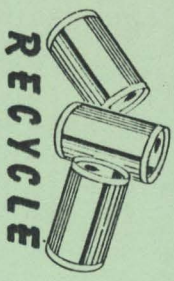
"THE BEST PARTY IN TOWN"
