Also, six local agencies are collecting food and financial contributions to help feed the disadvantaged, elderly or handicap. They are: Coalition for Battered Women, Community Kitchen, Department of Social Services, Durham County Mission Society, Meals on Wheels, and Operation Breakthrough.

Adopt a resident from the Murdoch Center by buying a mentally retarded person between the ages of 6 to 85 a "Cottage Gift" such as batteries, pinball games or recliner.
