Last Sunday afternoon we joined with our neighbors in the West End Community in a march against drugs and violence. About 40 persons from our congregation joined about 100 others in voicing a determination to "take back the neighborhood." I admire the leaders of that community who have lifted up their children and youth as a central concern and who with courage are determined to drive the drug dealers out. It felt good and right for us to be with them; and in reality, it is as much our neighborhood as theirs. Without a doubt our "work" on the streets felt like an extension of our Sunday morning liturgy; and the sharing of Christ's body and blood an extended act.

Worship is central for the constant cleansing and renewal of the life of a Christian. This Sunday you will be given the opportunity to worship at Duke Memorial twice within hours. It is an opportunity which I hope you will not miss. At 3 o'clock in the afternoon the United Methodists of the Durham District (which includes some 64 congregations) will gather to celebrate our common ministry and connection. It is our annual Lay Rally. Our very own bishop, Bishop C. P. Minnick will be the preacher, and the occasion will be an opportunity for you to become better acquainted with him through the word which he will bring. The sevice of worship will be followed by a reception, prepared by our United Methodist Women. We are grateful to them. I hope you will come and worship with us.

JOIN CLUB 52




