There are two sets of mountains which are breathtaking and which fascinate me to no end: they are the Andes and the Swiss Alps. I have been able to look upon both from various perspectives and a number of times. They are worlds apart, and mountains with different messages.

It wasn't easy leaving the beauty of the Alps, capped with snow even in July. Their beauty and wonder is indescribable and they draw you into an easy friendship; their danger is deceptive and illusive. My family thinks I'm obsessed with the Matterhorn, rising in unique form some 14,500 ft.; and maybe I am. The Alps are so very clean and fresh looking, so very symmetrical, so very orderly and neat in appearance - - a lot like the Swiss people.

The Andes: they're scary, awesome and mysterious; they're hardly symmetrical, oddly rugged and haggard looking; they appear haunting. But so is the history of the Peruvian people, through whose country this mountain range runs. They are a people who are likewise haggard and haunted by a history of colonialism and oppression. Their suffering, their hunger, and poverty is so very uninviting to those on the outside. These mountains reflect their people. The Peruvians are a beautiful people but haunted by poverty and oppression: yet a very caring and hopeful people.

From October 18 - 28, I will lead a delegation of about 8, mostly Duke Memorial members, on a mission trip to Peru as part of the official covenant which has been established between the North Carolina Annual Conference and the Methodist Church of Peru. I have given leadership to this covenant of mutuality over the past 5 years, since its inception. We have been able to support their struggling church in many ways. But I could not give enough testimony to how a people so oppressed and yet so faithful have given spiritual renewal to me and many others who have come to know them.

I appeal for your support and prayers as we prepare ourselves for this mission trip over the next several months. There will be opportunities for you to offer such support and I pray that you will be so willing. Grace and peace to you all.
