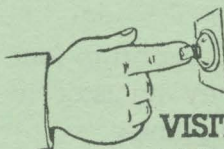

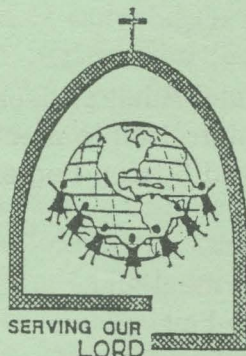


#### **THURSDAY STUDY GROUP**
