MINISTER'S MESSAGE

As most everyone knows, on this past Saturday evening, December 4th, a young woman was abducted from our church parking lot after leaving a community religious event which we were hosting and was taken to a nearby location and sexually assaulted. I was distressed to learn of this crime which came to our attention Monday morning by way of the news! That same morning our church staff gathered and prayed for the woman who had been assaulted and spent over four hours discussing the concerns and the ways in which we need to respond. I know of very few people who are not saddened by the increasing crime and violence in our community and we are disturbed all the more the closer it comes to home.

On Monday I called Chief McNeil and at my request he sent Captain Sarvis to my office on Tuesday morning to discuss my concerns. I expressed to him how irritated I was that they had not contacted us about this crime which had taken place on our property. While part of his response was a promise to send over a Crime Prevention Team to help us determine anything more we could be doing to offer security, I was not satisfied with the response and plan to pursue it further.

You should also know that on Tuesday morning the woman who was assaulted contacted me and on Tuesday evening I spent several hours with her. I sat amazed as I listened to her apologetic voice, as she expressed concern for our church and that it was connected to this occurrence. "No, we're the ones who are sorry," I said. And I expressed gratitude that she had contacted me so that we could share in her pain and so that she might know our grief. I was thankful that she welcomed me to come visit her so that somehow we might minister to her. Please pray for this young woman and for all of us who struggle with the challenges of ministry in this place. In the midst of it all, I pray that our hearts might be quieted and that we might all know the peace which God promises in the Grace of this holy season.

BURGLAR ALARM NEWS Louis Robinson Operations Manager


It is with sadness that Duke Memorial decided a couple of months ago to install a rather sophisticated burglar alarm system in order to protect both persons and property. As you have probably already heard, we have had four break-ins in the past six months which have cost over \$10,000 in damage and lost property.

While this alarm system, now installed, will cut down on our losses and provide greater safety, it will also cause some inconvenience for our church members. It means that members having outside door keys can no longer just unlock the door and walk in outside of regular church hours without a code to disarm the security system.

Just 3 days after installation, we had a break-in to which the police responded. It was obvious that the intruders had immediately run away at the sound of the alarm. We are encouraged that this system will put an end to frequent violations of our property.

In order to prevent false alarms, we are changing all outside door keys. Members needing outside keys will be asked to come to the church and see me in order to get a new key. At this point you will be instructed as to the operation of the alarm system. All keys other than the outside doors will remain the same. You can still use your present key during regular church and office hours for another two weeks. At that time we will have exterior key pads on three of our outside doors. Instead of keys to these doors, you will be given a code number for entry.

We will try to make this as painless a transition as possible. We hope you understand and will be patient.


