MINISTER'S MESSAGE

In his account of our Lord's birth, Luke writes, "I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. And suddenly, "a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace ..."

Jesus tells his disciples, "Peace I give to you, not as the world knows it do I give it to you." In the gift of God's redemptive love comes the knowledge of a peace which Christ alone can give. But in a world where guns are more popular than Bibles, and where violence is preferred over reconciliation, we struggle as Christians to experience Christ's peace. Many around us are unfamiliar with Christ's peace.

Where is Christ's peace for the Elliot and Seagroves families in a community divided by race and violence? May God grant us to know that peace this holy season. Somehow, somewhere, I pray, may Christ's peace crowd out the warring which surrounds us. Are we part of the problem or are we willing to be made instruments of Christ's peace? I pray that God will keep us attune to the real work of Christmas as expressed by Howard Thurman:

When the song of angels is stilled. When the star in the sky is gone, When the kings and princes are home, When the shepherds are back with their flock, The work of Christmas begins:

> To find the lost. To heal the broken, To feed the hungry. To release the prisoner, To rebuild the nations, To bring peace among all.

To make music in the heart. Let us pray for that day when Christ will come again, and the lamb will lie down with the lion.


