There are places we go to center on God. Although we each have favorite personal places, the sanctuary of the church is the primary place where most Christians go to experience God.

From our early Judeo-Christian heritage, people have built large gathering places to allow the whole community of faith to worship together. In Deuteronomy 31: 12, we find the command of Moses to assemble the people (men, women, and little ones) that they might hear the Lord God. God initiates our relationship and calls us to become an inclusive family through that relationship (Exodus 12:26; 13: 8, 14).

Being Christian we commit to community or family relationships with other Christians. This is why we have congregational worship and build sanctuaries in Church buildings to accommodate the total church family.
