MINISTER'S MESSAGE

I want to use this space this week, first of all, to remind those of you who have not yet returned your stewardship surveys and pledge cards please to do so just as soon as possible. We wanted to get an earlier start on things this year so that we could have a firm budget set and persons lined up for ministry responsibilities, etc. before the end of the year. We are well on our way to meeting that goal but need everyone's cooperation in responding.

Secondly, let me share with you regarding several upcoming Sunday events:

November 6: We will celebrate All Saints Sunday, recalling the names of those who have died during this past year, and celebrating the Sacrament of Holy Communion in anticipation of the heavenly banquet in which we will all share.

November 13: Cecelia Brooks will be our preacher at the 11 AM service, and the message she will bring will be partial fulfillment of her ordination as a deacon in the Virginia Conference of the United Methodist Church. Immediately following this service of worship we will have our Charge Conference, led by our District Superintendent, Albert Shuler. We plan to be finished by 1 - 1:15 PM.

November 20: This Sunday I have designated as Access Sunday. This is a special day to provide the church an opportunity to recognize and celebrate the life and presence of persons with handicapping conditions in the life of the community and congregation and the responsibility we all have to eliminate the barriers which keep such persons from full participation. On this Sunday the word will be proclaimed in music by the Celebration Singers, a group of mentally challenged adults out of Alamance County, directed by Suzanne Smith. The service will be followed by a congregational luncheon of "Thanksgiving" sponsored by our workarea on Health and Welfare. The Celebration Singers will be our guests for lunch. Everyone is invited to stay for lunch. The cost will be announced.

In the evening, we will have our ecumenical Thanksgiving Worship Service, held this year at Temple Baptist, with Rev. Lloyd Burton, pastor of St. Mark AME Zion, preaching. This service will begin at 7:30 p.m., followed by a time of fellowship.

I appeal for your full participation in these opportunities of worship in the weeks ahead. It is through such full participation that we are all nurtured in our faith and receive grace to be faithful in our Christian journey. Grace & peace.
