# MINISTER'S MESSAGE

This is the third Advent and Christmas that our family has been privileged to be a part of the Duke Memorial community. The joy of being in ministry with you enlarges the joy of this blessed season. I have spent time these recent days thinking back over the ministry of this congregation during 1994 and I am encouraged by all that Christ has enabled us to do. We have faithfully pursued new visions of ministry with courage and with shared commitment. We seem to be willing to go where God would lead us. If, by God's grace, I could somehow help to create a ministry which was totally free of the worries of budgetary restraints, my joy would be complete. That requires a commitment by all of us and we are not there yet. But I pray some day.

I remember with fondness those of our community of faith who have died during this past year and who are no longer with us in the physical body. They are about thirtytwo in number. We embrace their memory and give God thanks for their faithful service through Duke Memorial and their continued service in God's heavenly kingdom.

At the same time we rejoice in those who have joined our congregation to share with us in Christ's ministry in this place. In 1994 those who have joined are, in number, including their children (who are regarded by the United Methodist Church as preparatory members; although I would just as soon regard them as full members!). These persons have taken vows of church membership, like all of us, and have committed themselves to being a part of our common ministry. We all need to work hard to welcome them in our midst and to find places for their faithful service. There is much to do and there should be no one who feels as if they have nothing to do as part of the ministry of our congregation. If you ever feel that way, I wish you would immediately call me. We will find a place for your gifts to be used in Christ's ministry.

On the first Sunday of 1995, which is the same as the first day of 1995, we will share together in the Wesley Covenant Renewal as part of our service of worship. This is a service in which we all recommit ourselves to Christ's ministry, offering our gifts and our very selves to Christ's work in this place. We have been claimed as God's own. God is sovereign over our lives and we are all too often reluctant to acknowledge that truth. The words of covenant renewal in which we shall share include these: "Let me be your servant. . . I will no longer be my own. I will give up myself to your will in all things. Lord, make me what you will. I put myself fully into your hands. . . I freely and with a willing heart give all to your pleasure and disposal."

# REAFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM SUNDAY, IANUARY 8, 1995

On the second Sunday of 1995, which is recognized by the Christian church as the Sunday of the Baptism of our Lord, we will share together in the Reaffirmation of Baptism. There will be a time in this service when all who have been baptized into Christ's church will be invited to come forward to the baptismal font to "remember" your baptism. This reaffirmation is affirmed by one's touching of the water, including if you wish the marking of your forehead with the sign of the cross, or simply by coming and looking upon the water. In this act of reaffirmation we recall what God has done for us in Jesus Christ and we proclaim together the steadfastness of God's promise to us. The message on this Sunday will be brought by our Associate Pastor, Robert Edwards, who will offer the sermon as partial fulfillment of the requirements for ordination as an Elder in the United Methodist Church. We hope that you will come and share in this very meaningful service.
