# Minister's Message

On this past Sunday, we shared together in the Wesley Covenant Renewal Service and sealed that covenant renewal with the Sacrament of Holy Communion. It is my hope that those who attended this service took with you the Wesley Covenant Prayer which was distributed and that you will keep this prayer prominently before you. Again, I suggest that you make this prayer a part of your daily living so that when we come together again on the first Sunday in 1996 we may pray this prayer together from our hearts. In the event that you were not able to be with us this past Sunday, I am including this prayer within this week's "Insights" so that all might have it.

As we follow our Lord along the pathway of his life and our salvation, this coming Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of our Lord by sharing together in the Congregational Reaffirmation of the Baptismal Covenant. As you may recall, we have used this service on the 2nd Sunday of the New Year over the past two years. Many have found it to be most meaningful. As last Sunday we reaffirmed our covenant of faith with God and sealed that covenant with the sacrament of Holy Communion, so on this coming Sunday we shall further acknowledge God's claim upon our lives by reaffirming our baptismal covenant. Our Book of Worship reminds us that "Baptism is an act that looks back with gratitude on what God's grace has already accomplished, it is here and now an act of God's grace, and it looks forward to what God's grace will accomplish in the future. While baptism signifies the whole working of God's grace, much that it signifies, from the washing away of sin to the pouring out of the Holy Spirit, will need to happen during the course of a lifetime." This Sunday, in our service of worship, you will be invited to come forward to the chancel where the baptismal font will be centered and to recall and reaffirm your baptism by looking upon the water, by touching it, or by placing your finger within the water and making the sign of the cross upon your forehead. These and other gestures will be appropriate as a way for us to "remember our baptism." May we then go forth to serve in the power of the Holy Spirit. Grace and peace to you all and may God bless our ministry in the year ahead.


# REAFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM SUNDAY, JANUARY 8, 1995
