Greetings! It is so good to be here at Duke Memorial UMC! All of you have welcomed us so graciously and helped us feel at home right away. Billy, Mary Beth, and I are all so grateful.

Moving to new places and facing new challenges have reminded me of some of my earlier experiences as a parent. Some of our most enjoyable moments have been watching Mary Beth learn how to do things for the first time. She tried for the longest time to crawl and I remember the first time she made it a few feet. She was very proud and so were her Mom and Dad. Then she noticed the other children her age beginning to walk and she had to try. We spent many hours bending down holding onto those two little hands, offering our assistance so she could walk. She couldn't quite do it by herself yet, but she was determined. Then that day she hoped for finally came. She took steps by herself. I have never seen such a look of joy on her face. (Our backs were rejoicing also!) It was amazing to watch how she tried to master this new task of walking. She fell a lot, but got right back up. Bruises and bumps did not stop her. What was so interesting to watch was that even though she was becoming more steady on her feet, she would still reach up to hold onto my finger when we would walk. I would gladly assist. It still is a joy today.

She has taught me a lot about life. She reminds me that we are called to try new things, to keep growing and facing new challenges before us. She reminds me over and over that when we fall or stumble, when we get bruised by life, God will provide those who will be there to help us up, to hold us while we cry, and help us try again. She reminds me that in those time I may feel I can handle everything by myself, I really don't have to do it alone. God will always be there to reach to for help. The Lord will give us guidance, safety, and strength along the way, and gives us the gift of one another. She teaches me about trusting and that there is joy in every new venture.

As my family and I made this transition, my thoughts returned to some of those experiences, and I gave thanks again for how we learn so much about faith and trust from our children. Jesus knew that about children. He calls each of us to "become like little children." As children of God, know that in all of our new adventures which continue to come our way and in all those challenges that face us as Christians, we can place our hands in God's hand and with God, we can know and believe all things are possible. Thanks be to God for our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who said "Let the children come unto me." Thanks be to God for children who teach so much. And thanks be to God for the opportunity to be in ministry with you here at Duke Memorial UMC.




If you have a mailbox at the church office, please check it on a regular basis. We are finding that many boxes are not checked for weeks at a time, and it make communication with you very difficult.
