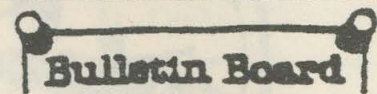

There will be a symposium entitled "Dating and Updating the Shroud of Turin" on Sunday, October 29, from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m. in the Griffith Film Theater on the lower level of the Bryan Student Center on West Campus of Duke University. Presenting on "Studies and Observations on the Image Formation" will be Dr. John Jackson, a physicist, founder, and leader of the forty person research team that tested the Shroud in 1978. Dr. Dmitri Kouznezov, a Russian biochemist, will be presenting on "Factors Affecting the Carbon 14 Dating of the Shroud." Father Albert Dreisbach, historian, theologian, and founder of the Atlanta Shroud Center, will be presenting on "History and Travels of the Shroud," and our own Dr. Alan Whanger, Chairman of Council for Study of the Shroud of Turin, will be presenting on "Images and Objects on the Shroud." There will be a panel and an opportunity for questions. There is no charge for admission. All are welcome to this opportunity to see and hear the evidence on one of the most remarkable and mysterious objects in existence.

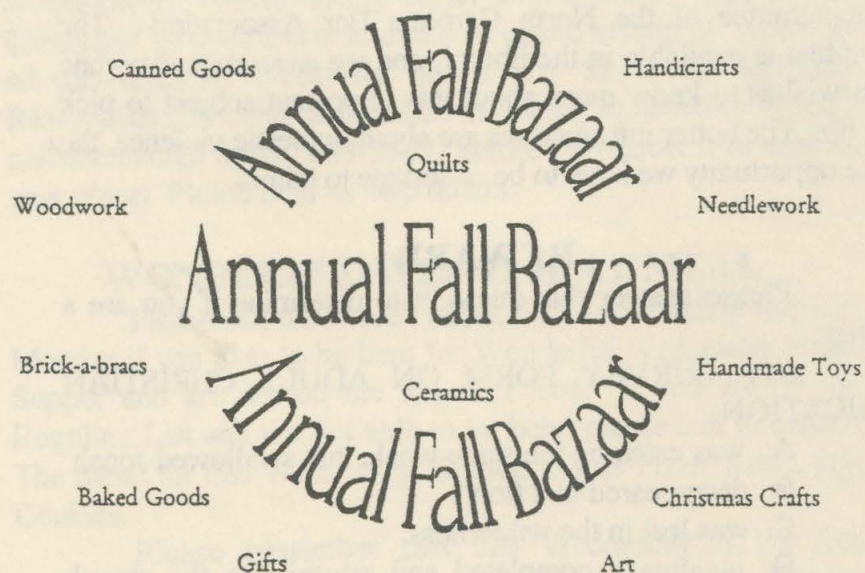
